About White Lake:

The White Lake Natural Resource Area is a 585-acre park in Hardwick Township owned and managed by Warren County with assistance from the New Jersey Youth Corps. Beneath the clear blue water of this 69-acre spring-fed lake lays a chalky marl bottom composed of freshwater mollusk shells and clay. A variety of habitats surround the lake, including fertile meadows, karst limestone exposures, sinkhole ponds, and stands of mature hemlock and hardwood forests. The shoreline is also home to various endangered or threatened plant species. In addition, the park is dotted with several cultural and historical points of interest, including a lime kiln and the stone wall remnants of an ice house/marl processing facility.

Explore Responsibly:

This park offers opportunities for hiking, biking, paddling, and wildlife observation.

Hunting is allowed by permit only.

Please stay on the marked trails and do not disturb sensitive habitats.

Removal of plants, animals, wood, stone, or other natural materials is prohibited.

Please remove and carry out trash.

Electric trolling motors are permitted on lake; gasoline motors and other motorized vehicles, such as ATVs, are prohibited in the park.

Fishing from the dock or boat is permitted; shoreline fishing is prohibited.

Swimming and wading are prohibited.

Enjoy miles of trails around White Lake, exploring the beautiful setting of this unique treasure.



Watch the bustling wildlife around you. Bald eagles, osprey, black bear, snakes, bobcats, and rare butterflies have often been spotted here.

Set out on your kayak or canoe and enjoy the crystal clear waters of the lake or go fishing for brown or rainbow trout, bass, sunfish, and even landlocked salmon!



Don't forget to stop by the Historic Vass Farmstead next door. With the County's support, the Hardwick Historical Society has beautifully restored this wonderful site.
